 make a list of the bibliographic records (author, title, journal name, date, page, vol.# issue # - if given) for each article. Indicate on that list the search tool you were using to find each article. if the article is available online - print the first page if the article is not online in that search tool, check to determine if it is online elsewhere; or, in paper; or, at Clarkson - and add that information.
1) Use <i>Academic Search Complete</i> - a general purpose tool for finding articles in major English-language periodicals in all subject areas.
2) Use <i>ACS Journal Search</i> - the search tool for finding articles in current and past years of all ACS journals.
3) Use <i>RSC Journal Archives Search</i> – a similar search tool for Royal Soc. journals
4) Use <i>PubMed</i> – click the link for "Advanced" at the top, and use "Search builder" to compose your search.
5) Use <i>Elsevier ScienceDirect</i> – enter your search terms in the "All fields" search box.
Remember, while some of these articles may be available in full-text online, for others you may have to request the article through Interlibrary Loan. Of these search tools, only <i>Academic Search Complete</i> includes built-in links to ILLiad - our Interlibrary Loan system.
