For the Library Workshop I assignment, you will use library resources to identify materials that meet the criteria listed. The entries you find will give you all of the information you need to answer the question in the format used for a "Works Cited" list. You will choose the format – MLA, APA, Chicago, Turabian, etc.

Start your research at the Libraries' Web site.

You will <u>find</u> the <u>books</u> you need using <u>BearCat</u> – SUNY Potsdam Libraries' online catalog.

- o To find books "by" search for the author's name
- To find books "about" search by subject
 - Search for subjects as keywords or browse a list of headings (Subject begins with...)
- BearCat records include all the information you need to locate the book and create your works cited entry.

To <u>find articles</u>, you can use the database of your choice but in class we used <u>Academic Search Complete</u>

- To find material that covers more than one topic, use the Boolean operator "and" to connect your subjects
- Use the database narrowing and limiting features to find articles that meet your specific criteria for both magazines and scholarly articles
