# Reference Collection



The part of the library's holdings that contain a selection of materials such as encyclopedias, dictionaries, almanacs, directories, or statistical sources as well as periodical indexes, and subject bibliographies. **They generally provide brief information for the initial stages of research.**

Encyclopedias in particular provide background information, set the framework and introduce the terminology for your topic.

# Finding Resources



## □ Reference Collection

### ▣ BROWSE – by CLASSIFICATION

- A system of arranging materials by subject - the Library of Congress Classification System is used in most academic libraries.

### ▣ SEARCH the Libraries' CATALOG – BearCAT

- A database that organizes the materials our library collects through bibliographic records that provide access by author, title, subject, etc. and identifies where these material are located.

# Finding Resources

- SUBJECT HEADINGS (Subjects; Descriptors) are based on a CONTROLLED VOCABULARY and are assigned to the records based on an analysis of content
  - ▣ A set of standard subject terms used by a database to describe the subject content of the items cited within the database
  - ▣ Frequently displayed in a thesaurus that describes relationships between terms – Broader, narrower, related
- KEYWORDS
  - ▣ a significant word or phrase in the text of a record in a database that is used as a search term in a free-text search to retrieve all the records containing it.

# Finding Books



- BearCAT – local holdings
    - ▣ Check status for location and availability
  - WorldCat – “universal” catalog with links to Interlibrary Loan service
- 
- Subject Headings are selected from the Library of Congress Subject Headings
  - Broad subject headings
  - Use index or table of contents to focus on topic

# Finding Articles

- General databases provide a good starting point
  - ▣ Is there a subject specific database that works for your topic?
- Academic Search Complete- example
  - ▣ Advanced Search
    - BOOLEAN SEARCHING
      - a technique that combines keywords using connecting terms called Boolean Operators in an online search tool. The three basic Boolean Operators are AND, OR, and NOT.
    - Limiters – type of resource; date range
    - Identification of subject headings (controlled vocabulary)
    - Option to narrow search by adding (Boolean AND) terms



# Keeping track of your research



- Research Log
  - ▣ Database/Search Strategy/Results/Analysis
- Vendor-level personal search accounts
  - ▣ Retrievable over time
  - ▣ Search strategies – ability to revise and/or rerun search
  - ▣ Mark and save specific citations from results lists
    - Separate results in named files
    - Add free-text notes
