3.	From the Libraries' web page, use "Start by Subject" to find research assistance for English.  Choose the tab for "Articles". Link to Academic Search Complete. Search for Margaret Atwood as a subject. [Note: invert the name – last, first]  a. How many results?
	b. Narrow your results to entries in Academic journals. How many results?
