Each can be different and include different types of things; arrangements can also be different

F127.J4H2 Haddock's Centennial History of Jefferson County, NY

Have several others on Jefferson County also

This one covers 1793-1894

Quote on title page re contents "Compiled..."

No table of contents

More general articles first, then by community (quite a few county histories follow this format)

City of Watertown earlier; then Watertown as a community later as well

Index in back is for places, personal names, companies, misc.

F 127.S2C8 Curtis Our County and Its People: A Memorial Record of St. Lawrence Country NY

Published in 1894.

Has table of contents

- Pt. 1 General history first, then separate chapters on some townships
- Pt. 2 Biographies
- Pt. 3 Personal Sketches

Indexes in back to 3 separate parts

F 127.S2D9 Durant History of St. Lawrence Co., NY, 1749-1878

Also known as Everts

Table of contents

General history, followed by cities & towns

Military history with muster rolls

Patrons record

Biographical record

No index

F 127.S2H8 Hough A History of St. Lawrence and Franklin Counties, NY

Pub. In 1853

Table of contents

General history

Biographical sketches

Wars

Geology, Mineralogy, Meteorology, etc.

Has maps inside

Index in back, by topic

Separately published index as well – F 127.S2S33 which has place names & personal references

F 127.F8S4 Seaver Historical Sketches of Franklin County and its Several Towns With Many Short Biographies

Published in 1918

Table of Contents

General histories first, then communities, then miscellaneous

Chapter XXVII The Underground Railroad

Biographical Sketches

Separate index: F127.F8S42 Genealogical by community (different sizes probably done at different times)
