#### **Find Books**

- BearCat College Libraries' catalog
- WorldCat comprehensive catalog including local holdings and a link to Interlibrary Loan

- Search topically by keyword or by subject
  - Use keyword search results to identify appropriate subject search
  - use " " or () for phrase searching

#### Find Articles

 "Start by Subject" to identify an <u>appropriate</u> <u>database.</u>

#### Academic Search Complete

- Database and Search Interface provided by EbscoHost ("Ebsco") includes "features":
  - ability to narrow results by adding (ANDING) additional subject terms
  - Date limiters
  - Choosing results from "Academic Journals" or "Magazines"
  - Abstracts!!

### Moving from the citation to the text

- Databases may include full-text for the indexed citation
- "Article Linker" connects database citations to any available full-text or to Interlibrary loan option

## Citing your sources

- WorldCat and most article databases offer an option to "cite this source" in a variety of styles. <cut and paste>
