Athletic Facilities

The SUNY Potsdam athletic facilities are centered around and within Maxcy Hall. The multi-million dollar facility was built in 1971 and has undergone several major revisions since then. It is considered one of the finest sports complexes in the country.

At the heart of Maxcy is the Bears' 2,500 seat ice arena, as well as, the 3,600 seat Jerry Welsh Gymnasium. Maxcy also houses a natatorium with an Olympic-sized swimming pool and a 33,000 square foot fieldhouse.

On the buildings third floor is the 8000 square foot Shane T. Shaul Fitness Center which was completely remodeled this fall.

Fifty acres of athletic fields surround Maxcy including the recently build all-weather AstroTurf N field. The turf field serves as the home for both lacrosse and soccer events.

A new women's softball field was also recently added while the tennis courts have been completely remodeled to include lights and a new court surface.

HEAD COACH

SHERRY DOBBS



Sherry Dobbs is now beginning his seventh season at the helm of the men's basketball program at SUNY Potsdam. With a six-year career record of 95-74 and a .562 winning percentage, Dobbs remains one of Potsdam's most successful basketball coaches.

Dobbs was chosen to lead the Potsdam men's basketball program in the summer of 2003. Prior to coming to Potsdam, Dobbs had been the top assistant at Ithaca College, where he was instrumental in helping the Bombers win the 2001-02 Empire Eight Championship and the 1999-2000 ECAC Upstate Tournament. Before Ithaca, Dobbs had coaching stops at St. Lawrence, and also here at SUNY Potsdam where he was the assistant women's coach at SUNY Potsdam. Dobbs played collegiately at SUNY Plattsburgh, where he earned his BA in 1993. He added an MS degree in teaching from SUNY Potsdam in 1998.

Dobbs philosophy is straight-forward. Everything starts with defense. His teams are well-coached, disciplined -- on and off the court -- and favor an up-tempo, in-your-face style. His emphasis on teamwork and sound fundamentals was illustrated during the 2005-06 season when the Bears led all of Division III in 3-point field goal percentage -- shooting 43.3 percent from beyond the arc.

This season marks the second year where all the players in the program have been recruited by Dobbs and his staff and he remains optimistic about their prospects.

"In the past, when we've made it to post-season, it's because we had a good team defensively. We have enough experienced players now, as well as, a good mix of new players that we should again be competing for the conference championship," Dobbs noted.



STAN COHEN

ASSISTANT COACH



Having worked with the men's basketball program at SUNY Potsdam for over 36 years, Stan Cohen is the longest tenured person on the Bears coaching staff. The Bears Hall of Fame member, who first began working with Coach Welsh in 1971, continues today as an assistant coach for Sherry Dobbs.

Cohen has been with the Bears during two National Championships, their 60 game winning streak, six SUNYAC Tournament Championships and numerous NCAA appearances. The Bears had a total of eight players named All-Americans during Cohen's watch.

A graduate of Hobart College, Coach Cohen served as co-captain of the 1955-56 men's basketball team. Cohen's team still holds the record for the best win-loss percentage in the history of Hobart basketball.

"Stan's wisdom and experience have been a tremendous help to both myself and our basketball team. He is very good teacher of the game and has an excellent rapport with our players," commented Coach Dobbs.

A tireless worker, Jon will work on the development of our perimeter players. Jon's understanding of the game and the Bears system make him a valuable addition to the men's coaching staff.





2009-10 Potsdam Men's Basketball Outlook

Head coach Sherry Dobbs Jr. begins his seventh season (94-72 career record) at Potsdam facing a tough rebuilding task with the loss of six seniors to graduation including All Conference selections Damon Brown and Alvin Dike. Dobbs is hoping to transition this year's team to a fast up-tempo style to counter a lack of interior size and take advantage of his clubs' speed and athleticism.

Senior Anthony Williams Jr. (Brentwood, NY/Upper Room Christian) and junior Eddie Cross (Hudson, NY/Shaker HS) lead seven returning players to the Potsdam roster. Williams started 27 games and averaged 6.5 ppg and 3.3 rpg from 2006-2008 and has the most game experience on the roster. Williams has the ability to play inside and outside and Dobbs is looking to him for senior leadership. Cross saw spot duty the last two seasons behind a wealth of experienced backcourt talent, but Dobbs expects Cross to have a breakout season.


Sophomore center Tom Kelso (Ogdensburg/Ogdensburg Free Academy) showed much promise during his first year in the program averaging 7.6 ppg and 6.2 rpg. Dobbs notes that Kelso is the only experienced post player in the program, so he will have to provide inside scoring and rebounding while trying to stay out of foul trouble.

Potsdam's remaining returnees include sophomore guards Orlando Minott (Bronx/Samuel Gompers), Eric "Skip" Schwartz (Pittsford, NY/Pittsford-Mendon), Marco Diaz (Bronx/Samuel Gompers), and Derek Denteh (Queens/Martin VanBuren). Minott had flashes of brilliance in his first season at Potsdam, starting 9 contests and averaging 3.9 ppg. Schwartz is a three-point specialist (19-51 for 37% in 2009) who will move into a regular role this season. Diaz excels as a defensive stopper while Denteh provides quality depth at both guard positions.

Sophomore forward Mitch Howe (Fayetteville/Jamesville-DeWitt) joins the Bears after a medical red-shirt last season. Howe was a regular on the J-D's state Federation champions in 2007-08 and is being counted on to provide solid minutes in the post. Sophomore guard Wesley Francisco (Washington Heights/Humanities) also joins the squad.

Dobbs' incoming class includes junior transfer Ben Walker (New Smyrna Beach, FL), who was an all-Region III selection in 2007-08 at North Country CC where he averaged 17 ppg, and first year recruits Joshua Lambert (Brooklyn/East NY Transit Tech), and Curtis Pierce (Brooklyn/George Westinghouse), both Class A All State Selections from the tough PSAL. Walker is an athletic combo guard who excels defensively and in the transition game. Lambert is an exciting point guard, who has an explosive burst to the hoop, and Pierce is a versatile athlete who can play all five positions.

Sharpshooter Jordan McAllister (Cornwall ONT/St. Joseph's Catholic), who averaged 25 ppg as one of the top prep players in Eastern Canada, and Cody Clary (Massena, NY/Massena), who led the Raiders to the overall Section X title, round out the incoming class. Both are expected to see playing time in the Bears up-tempo style.

2008-2009 SEASON REVIEW

The Bears enjoyed a successful start on the year with wins over Hobart, Paul Smith's and Clarkson University and they won the Casella North Country Tip-Off Classic in late November.

December started off with wins over SUNYAC foes Geneseo and Brockport. The Bears went into the holiday break on a losing note as they lost a close contest with St. Lawrence.

The New Year brought a 76-73 defeat to St. Joseph's of Long Island and a 75-66 loss to Montclair State followed by a pair of conference losses at Buff State and Fredonia. Ithaca also spoiled the Bears January play before the men added their first win of the month with a close 61-58 triumph over New Paltz. Despite some conference losses, Potsdam defeated Plattsburgh and Oswego as they closed the month of January.

Two early February home games provided a pair of conference wins as the men downed Plattsburgh 64-60 and Morrisville 66-51. These were followed by losses at both Brockport and Geneseo. The Bears ended the regular season on a high note as they defeated Cortland 68-61 at home and New Paltz on the road 74-71.

After qualifying for post-season conference action, the sixth-seeded Potsdam men took on No. 3 Oswego State at Max Ziel Gymnasium in Oswego where they ended their season for the second straight year in the quarterfinal round of the SUNYAC playoffs after losing 92-87.

The Bears have appeared in the NCAA Division III tournament in two of the past six seasons, and overall have made 15 appearances in the Division III tournament since its inception in 1975, winning national titles in 1981 and 1986, and advancing to the championship game in 1979, 1982, & 1984. Potsdam's overall record in Division III Tournament Games is 35 wins against 13 losses.

Potsdam has recently won two State University of New York Athletic Conference tournament titles, and won the regular season championship in two out of the last six years.

The Bears have had All-American players in basketball fourteen times since 1973. Three of those players were named NCAA Division III Player of the Year.

STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

Throughout the 1950's, collegiate athletic directors from a number of New York State institutions discussed the idea of forming an athletic conference. On a Sunday afternoon in Albany, May 1958, representatives from eight schools met for an organizational meeting and ratified a constitution. The second meeting was held at Cortland State Teachers College on September 19, 1958. This meeting marked the start of the New York State Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NYSIAC), which later was re-designated the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) in 1963.

Originally, the league sought, among other things, to serve as a model for public school athletic organizations and to help strengthen the physical education programs of member institutions. By 1974-75, the SUNYAC voted to focus on its role of providing a program of intercollegiate athletic competition among its member schools. The governing body consisted of the athletic directors from each institution. In August, 1979 Commissioner Dr. Patrick R. Damore was appointed to administer the conference. He is starting his 30th year as commissioner (2008-09).

The conference governing body was composed of the athletic directors until 1983 when the women's teams joined the conference. The governing body is now composed of the athletic directors and senior women administrators. In the beginning, the NYSIAC was open to any Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) member in New York State. Currently, the SUNYAC limits its membership to four-year colleges and universities in the State University of New York system.

The charter members in 1958 included Albany, Brockport, Buffalo State, Cortland, New Paltz, Oneonta, Oswego, Plattsburgh and Potsdam. The following year, Geneseo and Fredonia joined the league. Other eventual members included Binghamton (1973-74), SUNY Buffalo (1978-79) and SUNY Utica/Rome (1991-92), which is currently known as SUNYIT. Over the years, a few member schools have withdrawn for limited periods of time from the conference. Today, 10 institutions excluding Albany, SUNY Buffalo, Binghamton, and SUNYIT, continue to compete in the SUNYAC.

One of the nation's strongest NCAA Division III conferences, the SUNYAC extended its athletic prowess in 1983 when the institutions' women's programs became part of the SUNYAC. The conference administrative organization was changed to include a women's division and a men's division with the governing body composed of representatives from each institution. In 2003, the confer-

ence reorganized the governing structure and eliminated the men's and women's division to become one administrative group. The executive committee has the President, President-Elect, the Past President, the conference Senior Women's Administrator, a member of the governing body at large and the commissioner as an ex-officio member.

Presently, the conference members compete in 20 sports: nine for men and eleven for women. In 2008-09, the SUNYAC will crown men's team champions in baseball, basketball, cross country, ice hockey, indoor & outdoor track, lacrosse, soccer and swimming/diving. During the year, the league will also offer women's championships in basketball, cross country, field hockey, indoor & outdoor track, lacrosse, soccer, softball, swimming/diving, tennis and volleyball.

No strangers to NCAA postseason tournaments, the SUNYAC membership boasts a number of national championship teams and countless All-Americans. In 1955, Brockport brought the SUNYAC its first NCAA championship in men's soccer. In 1973, Cortland brought the next championship in men's lacrosse and won the title again in 1975. In 1974, Brockport captured the NCAA men's soccer championship and the school's wrestling dynasty produced NCAA titles in 1977, 1980, 1982, 1983 and 1992, while SUNY Buffalo captured the title in 1978. The Potsdam men's basketball team won the national championship in 1981 and 1986. The SUNYAC ice hockey program provided two NCAA Division III finalists in 1987 when Plattsburgh defeated Oswego. Plattsburgh won the title in 1992 and in 2001. Meanwhile, the Cortland outdoor track squad in 1985 gave the SUNYAC its first women's national championship team. The Cortland women's cross country team produced seven more titles between 1989 and 1997. Cortland women's indoor track also captured the NCAA title in 1991, followed by women's soccer team in 1992 and women's field hockey team in 1993, 1994 and 2001. The Oneonta women's soccer team claimed the NCAA title in 2003 and the Geneseo women's cross country team won the NCAA title in 2005. In 2006, the Cortland men's lacrosse team won the national championship while most recently, Oswego ice hockey claimed the 2007 NCAA title.

One of the oldest small college conferences in the nation, the SUNYAC embarks upon its sixth decade with the same commitment to athletic and academic excellence that has remained the league's guiding light since its formation 50 years ago.
